## (In the beginning...)

Welcome to Our Mostly Agnostic Group Of Drunks! My name is \_\_\_\_\_ and I'll be your alcoholic host this evening.

Once again, it seems as if the world is on fire. The CDC recently updated Orange County's COVID status as "high", which is updated on a weekly basis. Even though it is still optional to wear masks at our meeting, we *strongly* encourage you to do so and treat everyone as if they have cooties. There are stylish masks on the table for your use, free of charge.

This is an **OPEN** meeting of Alcoholics Anonymous. *Anyone* may attend an **OPEN** meeting, including those who have problems other than alcohol. Because of this, the group asks that we focus on the solution rather than the problem.

Please turn off your cell phones or put them in **Pleasure Mode**. Let's start with a moment of silence to focus on why we're here.

## (Observe about 10 seconds of silence)

Thank you. Would someone please read the Alcoholics Anonymous Preamble?

## (Preamble is read)

At this time we'll go around the room and introduce ourselves. Please let us know if this is your *very first* AA meeting, or if this is your first time at *this* meeting. If you wish to remain anonymous you may simply say "pass" or make up an interesting name.

## (Start with YOU and then go around the room)

(If someone says they're here for the first time, **offer them a welcome packet**)



We have welcome packets on the table that are for anyone new to our group or new to AA. Please take one if you know someone that would benefit from it. There's a lot of great information inside.

Our 7th tradition says that we be fully self-supporting, declining outside contributions. The money we collect goes toward our rent and website fees and pays for the delicious French appetizers we forgot to bring tonight. We pass around this stylish purse so you can drop some cash into it. If you're like everyone else on the planet that doesn't carry cash, there are Venmo and PayPal cards inside the purse and on your tables. If you need help, just ask. You can donate as much as you'd like or nothing at all. Just keep in mind how much a drink would cost you. We ask that *only AA members* contribute.



Now for our group announcements:

- If you'd like to get involved with our group, please consider joining us at our business meeting on the *last* Saturday of each month, right here at 5:30 PM. Everyone is encouraged to attend. We need lots of help!
- Our group has its own website - [OMAGOD.org](http://OMAGOD.org). We answer frequently asked questions about our group and secular AA in general, provide links to valuable resources, and post upcoming AA related events and service opportunities, so check it out. The password for the members section is **pickles**.
- We have 5 meetings each week. We meet here on Tuesdays and Saturdays and on Zoom every Monday, Wednesdays, and Friday at 7 PM. The meeting ID and password for our Zoom meetings are listed on our website and there are flyers on the table.

- We would like to point out that while we are a *secular* meeting, there are many other AA meetings in the area. If you'd like to attend a traditional meeting with someone from our group, please ask me after the meeting tonight.

There are also announcements on our website. If you'd like to add an announcement, please see me after the meeting **(forward that information to our webmaster or GSR)**.

Let's get our meeting started. Here at OMAGOD we go around the room until everyone has had the opportunity to share. Please keep your shares responsibly brief and avoid talking directly to other people because nobody likes that. It's my responsibility to interrupt the meeting if something horrible happens, like someone going on too long or if lightning strikes me down.

Now, before we begin, does anyone feel like they want to drink tonight?


**(If may take a few moments for someone to speak up, please be patient. If someone feels that their sobriety is in danger, then draw a topic from their share. If not, continue...)**

Does anyone have a suggestion for a topic or a question for the group?

**(If someone has a question for the group, explain that we will each share our experience with the question, one person at a time. If someone brings up a topic, please summarize that topic before opening the floor (to make sure the topic relates to alcoholism). If no one offers a topic, spin the wheel for one.**

**Don't mention the restaurant. You'll spin again after the meeting)**

**(At 7:45)** "At this time we're going to open up the floor for those that didn't get an opportunity to share. Can I get a show of hands?"



**(At 7:52)** Before we close the discussion, does anyone have a burning desire to share something with the group or feel you might drink tonight? Say it now, don't take it home with you.

**(Allow a few moments to pass before moving on)**

Thanks for a (**Marvelous, Magnificent, Splendid, Spectacular, Impressive, Glorious, Superb, Notable, Majestic, Awe-Inspiring, Breathtaking, Sumptuous, Resplendent, Grand, Fantastic, Enjoyable, Fantabulous, Incredible, Tremendous, Phenomenal, Wonderous, Pleasant, Excellent, First-Rate, First-Class, Amazeballs, Peachy, Badass, Rad, Bitchin', Top-Notch, Swell, Dandy, Phat, Dope, Radical, Sound, Cool, Clever, Out-of-this-World, Wicked, Mega Marvo, Mind-Blowing, Inciteful, Bodacious, Bonzer, Astounding, Groovy Breathtaking, Extraordinary, Shocking, Surprising, Unbelievable, Prodigious, Astonishing, Insightful, Honest, Touching, Staggering, Stupendous, Heart-Stirring, Heart-Stopping, Spine-Tingling, Overwhelming, Thrilling, Uplifting, Bizarre, Unprecedented, Special, Unique, Out of the Ordinary, Phenomenal, Monumental, Gnarly, Heavy, Uncommon, Boss, Flashy, Fantastical, Outlandish, Glorious, Sweet, Splendid,**
