


I'm not CrAzY! Navigating Mental Health in Recovery*

Join us as a panel of medical and mental health professionals discuss the complexity of addressing mental illness in the rooms. Our panelists include Dr. Kimberlin R Richards, MD, a psychiatrist with over 20 years of experience in the mental health industry, specializing in addiction psychiatry; Marya Hornbacher, award-winning journalist, New York Times bestselling author, and the recipient of the Fountain House Humanitarian Award for writing and advocacy around addiction and mental health; and Jeffery Munn, board-certified psychotherapist and author of *Staying Sober Without God*, a book that has quickly become secular AA's literature standard. Topics covered involve psychiatric medication, PTSD, pain management, eating disorders, available therapy options, followed by a question-and-answer session.

George F. Koob, Ph.D., is an internationally recognized expert on alcohol and stress, and the neurobiology of alcohol and drug addiction. He is the Director of the National Institute on Alcohol Abuse and Alcoholism (NIAAA), where he provides leadership in the national effort to reduce the public health burden associated with alcohol misuse. As NIAAA Director, Dr. Koob oversees a broad portfolio of alcohol research ranging from basic science to epidemiology, diagnostics, prevention, and treatment.

Bill W. is a professor of biology and wrote *12 Secular Steps: An Addiction Recovery Guide*. AA's Big Book is a treasure of brilliance and contradictions. For instance, the assertion in 1939 that alcoholism is a disease was groundbreaking. But in the same breath the disease concept was coupled to the necessity of faith healing and an interventional God (use Higher Power if you don't like the G word). In this talk, we explore the continuity of a modern, evidence-based model of addiction with secular adaptations of 12-Step recovery work.
